

Budapest's Boutique Bookshop Goes Cashless

The first completely cashless bookshop has launched in the prestigious 3rd district of the Hungarian capital of Budapest. Boutique bookshop BOOKR goes completely cashless from mid-November, but owner Dorka Horvath is not at all worried about losing business when the change takes place, as her business already has a 70 percent card turnover and just 30 percent cash. Dorka has already prepared customers for the complete transition, most of whom are happy to embrace cashless purchases if it results in better service. Those customers who are a little cautious about paying by card are happy to do so when Dorka explains that it is actually cheaper and easier than paying by cash.

Dorka feels the switch to fast easy electronic payments will free up time for her to focus on her core business while offering customers extra services, such as coffee and cakes to enjoy in the bookshop. The launch follows the success of major cashless music festivals, theatre and ticket vending machines in Budapest.
